  - \$18,000 expense comes from matching 8 student stipends (\$10K), miscellaneous activities + supplies (\$4K), travel to national meeting in Chicago (\$4K)
- Weyenburg – again, will work with Dale to specify details here
- Will chat with Gina offline to clarify how her grants will fit into the related line items here (CCEW, NCW, outreach) and elsewhere

# Public Outreach 2025



- Types: Classroom Visits (Science Coaching, Special Needs, etc), Public Events for all ages; camps
- Funded by Local Section and Special Grants
- 31 classroom visits, 11 with >75 students + Two Girls Day Out Events at Delta
- 62 “Activities” to be reported, not counting over a dozen meetings for the 2025 and 2026 Expos. Project with Northwood Marketing students to enhance Expo participation.
- Time-consuming multi-day activities: Exhibit discussions with Northwood, Exhibit planning and set-up with Bay County Historical Society.
  - Camp: six months preparations □ presentation, ~22 students, free, 9 non-ACS presenters, 10 volunteers
  - Garden: 155 hours, 775 lb of produce donated to three food pantries, 8 ACS volunteers—**INFO ON 2026 coming shortly**
- Events: School STEM and Science fair “nights” in Auburn, Midland, BC, and Essexville. **Pumpkins and Pizza, “Are you a pHoodie?”, Frankenstein Friday (CMU), Two Mall programs (Midland and Saginaw)**
- **Senior Chemists Table at CERM—“Chemistry Quickies”**
- Special Needs programs at two schools: Highland Pines (Tuscola) and Freeland Middle (Saginaw). Five visits; 75 at HP, ~15 at FMS each time, **some Q4**
- Exhibit related programs: 7 school group visits to the CMU exhibit. **Four hands-on programs and one presentation at the BC Exhibit.**

## 2026 Outreach Preview

- **KIDS' DAY at the Midland Mall—Jan 17, 10-3**
- Classroom visits by Coaches
- Garden: investigating two new locations, both with educational opportunities; transplant of many perennials last November
- Continued programming at BC Exhibit, including possible summer programs with Bay Area YMCA which is within walking distance
- Earth Action Expo April 25 at Dow High School: FREE. 10-3
  - Food Trucks
  - EVs
  - Speakers
  - >70 exhibitors
  - **Illustrated Poem Contest**
- FREE Middle School Summer Camp June 15-19, 9-12
